- work with parents and students to help ensure every student achieves their full potential
- encourage and insist on the highest standards of behaviour
- make lessons engaging and interesting
- report regularly to parents and students on progress and explain what they need to improve
- keep parents and students informed about academy activities, check and sign all planners
- develop mutually beneficial partnerships with employers and the community
- welcome parents as partners in the work of the academy and treat parents and students with respect
- provide a balanced and relevant curriculum
- regularly seek the views of parents and students on their experiences in the academy and feedback on how we have acted on recommendations

**Parents/Carers will:**

- ensure that my daughter/son attends the academy, on time, properly equipped and wearing academy uniform
- make the academy aware of any concerns or problems that might affect my daughter's/son's work or behaviour
- encourage my daughter/son to behave well and respect the rights of others to learn without disruption to lessons
- ensure my daughter/son always completes their homework and I will sign the planner weekly
- attend Parents' Evenings, Information Evenings and discussions about my daughter's/son's progress
- communicate with academy staff as per the contact procedure and in a climate of mutual respect
- work in partnership with the academy to promote the best interests of my daughter's/son's education
- advise the academy if my daughter/son may be photographed, filmed or interviewed for publicity purposes via the annual data checking sheet
- agree to follow the established absence reporting procedure
- ensure the academy has the most up to date contact details

**Students will:**

- aim for 100% attendance and always be on time
- be polite and respectful to others in the community as they travel 'to and from' the academy
- follow any sanctions set by academy staff

# Academy Rules

## At the start of a lesson:

- Arrive on time, in full uniform.
- Enter the room quietly and sensibly.
- Sit in the seat allocated to you as per the seating plan.
- Get out everything you need for the lesson. This will always include a pen, pencil, ruler and your student planner.
- Put your bag away.
- Remain silent while the register is called.

## During a lesson:

- Immediately follow all requests from your teachers. If you feel that something is unfair, speak politely to the teacher at the end of the lesson.
- Remain silent while the teacher is talking to the class.
- If a question is asked put up your hand and wait until you are asked to answer.
- Gum, phones, gaming devices and headphones are not permitted in the academy. Leave food and drink in your bag. You are allowed to keep a clear bottle of water in your bag and drink from it during lessons other than science. The bottle must contain only plain water. Energy drinks are not permitted.
- Work hard and concentrate on your own work and complete your work to a high standard.
- If you are asked to move seats, for whatever reason, move quickly and quietly.
- You will only be allowed to go to the toilet during a single lesson if it is a real emergency. In double lessons a teacher may let you go to the toilet. Use morning break and lunchtimes to use the toilet facilities.
- You will not be permitted to go to the toilet just before breaks or lesson changeovers.
- Record all homework set in your Student Planner and check ClassCharts regularly.
- Be respectful, Be ready, Be reasonable.

## At the end of a lesson:

- Pack away only when your teacher asks you to.
- Help to tidy the classroom and pick up any scrap paper. The class should do this as a team, not worrying about who actually used equipment or dropped a piece of paper.
- Leave the classroom only when your teacher tells you to. Leave quietly and sensibly.

## Movement around the Academy Campus:

- Walk along the corridors. If you run you may cause injury to yourself or others.
- Walk on the left, following the instructions on signs.
- Behave in a quiet and sensible manner.
- Help younger students or those with an injury.
- Students are not permitted to use the lift unless they have been issued with a lift pass.
- Do not use the main central staircase near the atrium. This is a privilege for Year 11, Sixth Form and Staff.
- You must use the student entrance via Stone Breck when arriving and leaving the academy.

### **Health and Safety:**

- Smoking is bad for your health. This is a non-smoking campus for all. Any students caught smoking on site will be issued with a fixed term exclusion. Any cigarettes, tobacco, lighters, vapes and other such items will be confiscated.
- Only bring roll-on or pump action products if you need to use them after PE or other exercise. Leave aerosol cans at home.
- Energy drinks are not permitted. These have been proven to pose heart risks to teenagers due to high levels of caffeine. Any student with an energy drink will have it confiscated.
- Avoid bringing large bottles of fizzy drink to the academy. These may be confiscated.

### **The Academy Environment:**

- Take care of property belonging to the academy and to others. If you cause damage to property belonging to others, either deliberately or by irresponsible behaviour, you will be asked to pay for it or attend Victory community service.
- Keep the academy tidy by using the litter bins provided and encouraging other students to do the same. Students may choose to litter pick in exchange for a reward – to keep the academy environment remaining tidy.

### **Uniform:**

- Always wear your uniform unless you have a signed note for any non-uniform items from your Head of Year (Behaviour). You may be isolated if you do not wear the correct uniform. In most cases you will be given 24 hours to rectify the uniform issue or borrow spare stock.
- If you have a note signed by the Behaviour Team, show it to your teacher at the start of each lesson.
- Notes will normally be for one day and will not be issued for longer than one week. If there is still a problem after one week, see the Behaviour Team to discuss the problem.
- Conform to the jewellery rules, which allow no jewellery, other than a watch and one pair of small plain metallic/diamante ear studs worn in the ear. If you have any other form of visible piercing it must be left empty during the academy day. If you have a new piercing you will be expected to remove it or add a clear/flesh coloured retainer. Facial and body piercings are not permitted.
- Medic Alert bracelets are not considered to be jewellery.
- Conform to the academy rules on hair styles and make-up.

### **Respect for other Students:**

- There are other ways to solve problems than with physical or verbal abuse towards other students. If you are feeling very angry with another student, discuss the problem with your Tutor or the Behaviour Team.
- If you attack another student, expect to be **excluded** from the academy. In serious cases, we may decide to inform the Police.
- Stealing and causing damage deliberately or irresponsibly will always be dealt with very seriously.

**Break and Lunchtimes:**

- At break, either go outside to your year group area or in the canteen, or in wet weather, in your allocated area.
- You are not permitted upstairs at break or lunchtime or to wander the buildings in groups.
- You are not allowed to leave the academy premises during these times.
- Lunchtime Lockdown is used to isolate students who cannot behave sensibly and safely at student free times. Alternatively, these students may be asked to stand with their Head of Year.

**Personal Property:**

- We request that expensive, personal property that is not needed in lessons is left at home. If you chose to ignore this advice, personal property must be placed safely in lockers or with PE/PA staff during lessons. The academy will not accept responsibility for personal property or be expected to help find or replace it, if you chose to bring in personal property
- If you wear jewellery in the academy or use things like phones, iPods or toys in lessons or around the academy, they will be confiscated. The items will be kept in the main reception until your parents collect them.
- If you are seen with a mobile phone it will be confiscated. A message will be sent home to inform your parents/carers and this will be kept in the main reception until they collect it.

**Off-Site Events:**

- Students are expected to abide by the Code of Conduct and follow the rules when representing the academy or attending any off-site educational visit/trips, events, sporting fixtures, exchange visits, etc.

The academy will issue the relevant consequence for any disregard of the Academy Rules.
