Grammar Points:

Gramática

Adjectives have masculine and feminine forms, and singular and plural forms.

If an adjective ends in **-o** in the masculine form, it changes to **-a** in the feminine form. If it ends with any other letter than **-o**, it stays the same.

singular		plural	
masculine	feminine	masculine	feminine
amarillo	amarilla	amarillos	amarillas
blanco	blanca	blancos	blancas
verde	verde	verdes	verdes
azul	azul	azules	azules

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Gramática

Spanish verb endings change to show the person the verb refers to. Regular verbs work like this:

¿Cómo te llamas? What are you called?
 Me llamo... I am called...
 ¿Dónde vives? Where do you live?
 Vivo en... I live in...

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Gramática

Ser (to be) is an important irregular verb.

soy I am
eres you are
es he/she is

To make a sentence negative, put **no** before the verb.

No soy tímido. I am **not** shy.
No es verdad. It is **not** true.

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Gramática

In Spanish, the word 'a' changes, depending on whether a noun is masculine or feminine. The words for 'a' in Spanish are:

masculine	feminine
un	una
hermano	hermana
a brother	a sister

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Gramática

Adjectives have masculine and feminine forms. Many adjectives end in **-o** or **-a** in the singular.

masculine	feminine
sincero	sincera
tímido	tímida
generoso	generosa
serio	seria
listo	lista
tonto	tonta
simpático	simpática
tranquilo	tranquila
divertido	divertida

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Gramática

In Spanish, all nouns are either **masculine (m)** or **feminine (f)**. There are four words in Spanish for 'the':

	singular	plural
masculine	el tigre (the tiger)	los tigres (the tigers)
feminine	la jirafa (the giraffe)	las jirafas (the giraffes)

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Estrategia 1

Look, say, cover, write, check

Use the five steps below to learn how to spell any word.

- 1 **LOOK** Look carefully at the word for at least 10 seconds.
- 2 **SAY** Say the word to yourself or out loud to practise pronunciation.
- 3 **COVER** Cover up the word when you feel you have learned it.
- 4 **WRITE** Write the word from memory.
- 5 **CHECK** Check your word against the original. Did you get it right? If not, what did you get wrong? Spend time learning that bit of the word. Go through the steps again until you get it right.
