## How to structure a creative writing answer (Q5)

Mini Paragraph: **describe the weather**  
(The sun was...The wind was...The rain  
was...)

Main paragraph 1: **describe the setting  
as suggested by an image / your  
imagination**

Mini paragraph: **bridging sentences to  
segway into a flashback** (past memory  
e.g. Catching sight of ...I was reminded  
of the time when....)

Main paragraph 2: **the flashback**  
(memory) to a significant moment from  
the past

Mini-paragraph: **return to weather with  
a twist** to create a meaningful, cyclical  
structure (The sun was now/still...The  
wind was...The rain was...but....)
