Governor of the Bank of England Visit @ Victory



We were honoured to welcome Andrew Bailey, Governor of the Bank of England to Victory, to address our Economics and Business students. We were delighted to welcome students from Langley School, Norwich School, City of Norwich School, Hellesdon High School and Taverham High to join us for this wonderful event.

“It was an absolute pleasure to be able to meet Mr Bailey and welcome him to Victory, and it was really interesting to get an insight into his

role at the Bank of England. He answered lots of our questions, which allowed us to put into context what is going on in the world around us in terms of economics, and the part which I found most interesting was his discussion about the price of bread, and the impacts that external factors are having on prices in the UK. He also talked to us about how the economy works in the UK and what factors influence interest rates. It was a really valuable and exciting experience for me to meet someone who is so influential in UK economics, and we were also joined by a number of schools and guests from across the city, which allowed us to interact with other business and economics students and share our knowledge, as well as having some really interesting discussions about the talk.” Matthew Prior, Business and Economics, Year 12

“On Tuesday 7th November, the Governor of the Bank of England, Mr. Andrew Bailey held a presentation where he informed us on his role within the Bank and the different aspects of his job. I found it interesting how his job involves visiting places around England such as factories and also our school rather than mainly working from an office. 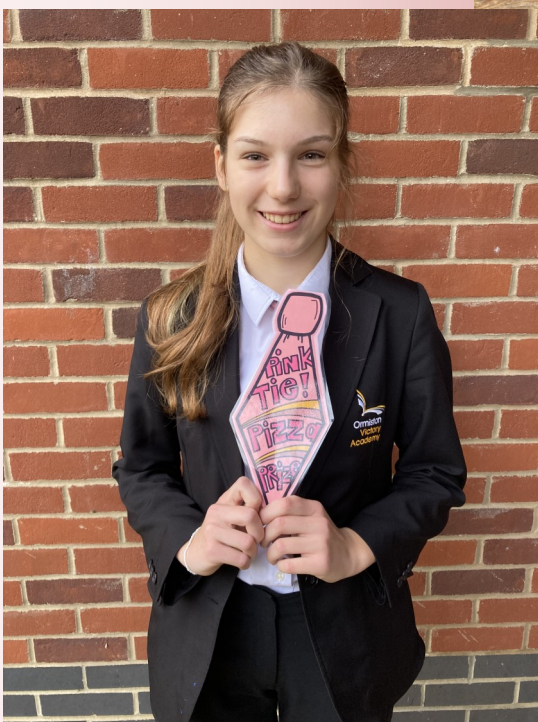




Year 10 Pink Tie Positivity @ Victory

A massive well done to Elijah who was voted as player of the tournament!

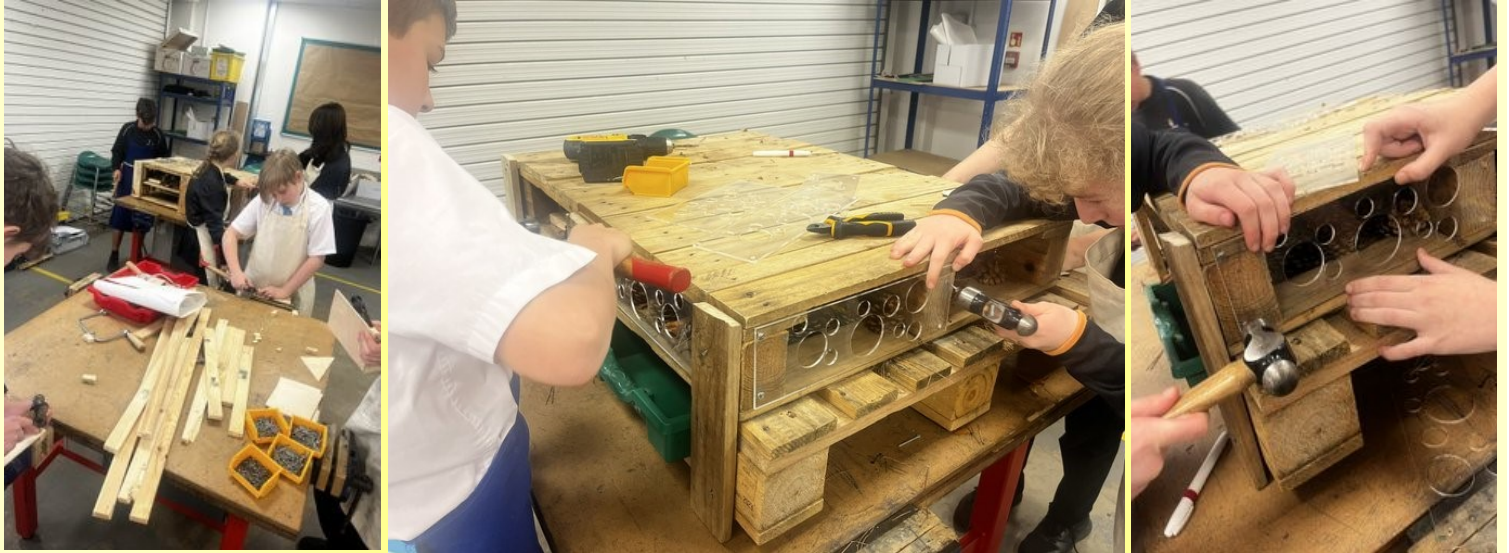
