Trips @ Victory

We are busy planning more trips for the coming two years - after the 'lockdown' life we know how important it is that we are able to offer these experiences to young people.

We are aware that finances are difficult at the moment for many - but we want to keep our enrichment offer strong as we know from many parents that whilst a family holiday abroad might not be possible for the next few years, our school can help our children carry on seeing the world with their friends.

I loved running the trip to Iceland with Mr Crosson-Rogers - it gave me so much joy seeing the enthusiasm the group had for travel and new experiences - it was such a pleasure to take them somewhere so exciting. Several students who came on this trip have asked for another 'cultural experience' next year, so we have been doing some research.

I know Mr Crosson-Rogers is keen to run the Iceland trip again in Spring 2025 (we would aim to offer payments over approximately 10 months) and for our potential A Level geography students, he is exploring a trip to Madagascar around Easter 2026 (aimed at current Year 10 for when they are in Year 12 to give 2 years of payments).

I have been looking into both Morocco and Naples (again we can spread the payments over almost a year). I would like to know if anyone has a preference between the two? I won't be able to run both. Please take a look at the itineraries below and if you'd like to email me expressing a preference, let me know. I will talk to Student Council to gather their views too.

Bay of Naples - June 2025 (£1100 approx):

- Day 1: Flight to Naples; visit to Herculaneum transfer to hotel in Sorrento
- Day 2: Visit to a lemon farm; a pizza workshop and a trip to the Amalfi Coast
- Day 3: Visit to Pompeii and Vesuvius
- Day 4: Ferry to the Isle of Capri and an ice-cream demonstration (and eating it)!
- Day 5: A tour of underground Naples and the flight home

Who can get involved?

Basically, EVERYONE.

The challenge is **inclusive** to all ages and abilities. We use adapted bikes and specialised equipment to ensure each and every person whatever their ability can get involved. We also love to have spectators to cheer on the partakers as well as helping to raise the profile of Able2B and these amazing children.

What is DYA?

It is a challenge that pairs up mainstream and SEN pupils in aim of reducing the stigma around disability. The pair complete a challenge that involves biking, using **adapted bikes** if necessary as well as some frame runners. We have access to a whole array of bikes to ensure all children can get involved. In addition to the biking, the participants complete a walking, running or pushing (wheelchair users) challenge.

The event is to celebrate & educate about inclusivity. Participants are encouraged to get sponsored for their challenge.

What about the adults?!!

A recent addition to DYA is an **adult sponsored walk**, a way to include all adults that are interested in taking on a new challenge. The adults of all ages and abilities set off around the course together with family, friends, and other volunteers to support them. A great support network and an amazing achievement.

Education from the National Crime Agency

Parents and carers letter

Dear parent/guardian,

All schools in the UK have recently been sent information from the National Crime Agency, raising awareness of the recent rise in reporting of financially motivated sexual extortion (a type of online blackmail often known in the media as 'sextortion'). Children and young people worldwide are being targeted.

This type of crime involves an adult offender (often from an organised crime group based overseas) threatening to release nude or semi-nude images and/or videos of a child or young person, unless they pay money, or meet another financial demand, such as purchasing a pre-paid gift card.

Victims of any age and gender can be targets, however a large proportion of cases have involved male victims aged 14-18.

A child or young person is <u>never</u> to blame if they have been a victim. Offenders will have tricked, groomed and/or manipulated them into sharing an image

Talking to your child

It's important to have frequent, open and non-judgemental conversations with your child about relationships, sex and being online to build trust and support them if something goes wrong. Financially motivated sexual extortion should be included in those conversations. Here are some tips about how to approach this:

- Chat regularly about their life online: have ongoing conversations with them about their life and time online. Continue to take an interest as they grow, explore new apps and sites together and talk in a balanced way, considering the benefits and the potential harms.
- Talk about where to find information about relationships and sex: organisations like <u>CEOP Education</u>, <u>Childline</u> and <u>Brook</u> have ageappropriate advice topics such as sexual communication and image sharing. This will help your child to understand what unhealthy relationships look like, such as applying pressure and blackmail; and give them trusted sources of information to explore these topics.

- Review privacy settings: talk to your child about the importance of using privacy settings on their accounts to restrict who can contact them. Read CEOP Education's advice on <u>how to talk your child about their</u> privacy settings.
- Make sure they know where to go for support: let them know that they can come to you with any concerns and won't be judged. It's also important to make them aware of other trusted adults or sources of support, if they feel they can't talk to you, such as Childline.
- Make sure they know where to report: remind your child how you can help them to report an incident to the police or using the CEOP Safety Centre. Let them know that if a nude or semi-nude of them has been shared without their consent, they can take these 3 steps to try and get them removed:
 - Use <u>Report Remove</u>, a tool from Childline and the Internet Watch Foundation. Your child can use this to remove images that have been shared or might be shared.
 - Use <u>Take It Down</u>, a tool from the National Center for Missing and Exploited Children. Your child can use this to remove or stop the online sharing of images or videos.
 - Report directly to the platform or app that the incident has occurred on. For advice on how to report to major social media platforms, visit <u>Internet Matters</u>.

What can I do if this has happened to my child?

If your child tells you that someone is trying to trick, threaten or blackmail them online:

- Don't pay, do stop contact and block: you may be tempted to pay, but there is no guarantee that this will stop the threats. As the offender's motive is to get money, once you have shown you can pay, they will likely ask for more and blackmail may continue. If you have paid, don't panic but don't pay anything more. Help your child to stop all communication with the offender and block them on any accounts that they have been contacted on.
- Avoid deleting anything: try not to delete anything that could be used as evidence such as messages, images and bank account details.

 Report to the police or CEOP: call 101 or 999 if there is an immediate risk of harm to your child. Or you can use the <u>CEOP Safety Centre</u> to report any online blackmail attempts.

If it has already happened and your child has shared an image and sent money to someone exploiting them:

- Reassure them that they've done the right thing by telling you: make sure they know they are not to blame for what has happened and they have done the right thing to ask for your help.
 Children and young people's mental health may be negatively impacted by experiences of exploitation; you can <u>find advice on looking after your</u> child's mental health from the NHS.
- Report to the police or CEOP: call 101 or 999 if there is an immediate risk of harm to your child. Or you can use the <u>CEOP Safety Centre</u> to report an incident. If your child is 18 and over, call 101 or 999 if they are at risk of immediate harm.
- Report any images or videos that have been shared: help your child to remove images that are online or prevent images being shared online by following these three steps:
 - Use <u>Report Remove</u>, a tool from Childline and the Internet Watch Foundation. Your child can use this to remove images that have been shared or might be shared.
 - Use <u>Take It Down</u>, a tool from the National Center for Missing and Exploited Children. Your child can use this to remove or stop the online sharing of images or videos.
 - Report directly to the platform or app that the incident has occurred on. For advice on how to report to major social media platforms, visit <u>Internet Matters</u>.
