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Dear Sixth Form Parents and Carers,

I write to introduce myself as the new Assistant Principal in charge of Lord Nelson Sixth Form, based at Ormiston Victory. I know that I may have taught History GCSE to some of your children – and some will be in my A Level classes. I currently lead on Teaching, Learning and Training at Ormiston Victory, but from September I am fortunate to be moving across to oversee Sixth Form too. For those of you who have joined us from other schools, I have been at Victory for 11 years – my subject is History, and I am also a keen sportsman (huge cricket fan) and I am lucky to have a wonderful young family.

I wanted to take the opportunity to tell you that I am very excited about the future of our Sixth Form and I am excited to work with the many wonderful students we have here. I am also keen to ensure that there are strong lines of communication between the school and the parents and carers of the students we support.

I spoke to our current Year 12s this week to share with them my vision for Sixth Form and discuss some of the changes that will be taking place next year. Next year the three key areas of focus will be:

- Excellent Attendance
- Excellent Achievement
- Varied and Personalised Enrichment

As part of my conversation with students, I have made clear that I have some key shared principles that will permeate through everything we do in Sixth Form. My expectation is that our students are the embodiment of these. These key principles are:

- 1) **Ambition** I expect us as a Sixth Form to be ambitious in everything we do. We should all have the ambition to 'do better'
- High expectations of ourselves and others I have the highest expectations of our students and they should have the highest expectations of what we can offer them as an institution.
- 3) **Community** This should be at the heart of everything we do. We should act to support and enrich our school community and the wider community the school serves
- 4) **Taking Ownership** We take ownership of everything we do. Every student needs to take ownership of their future and ensure they are doing everything they can to be successful

In the first place, attendance will be key at the start of next year. Students are expected to attend all lessons and timetabled sessions including form time and assemblies. Attendance is vital to achievement in Sixth Form. As such, we are in the process of putting together a new attendance policy. We will share this with you and all students in September. I am aware of the concerns that many students have around being in for form time and then not

having lessons until much later in the day – we are working hard to ensure this is not the case for September. Form time is crucial as it provides the much-needed pastoral support and communication system for our students.

As a Sixth Form, our commitment to you is that we will work tirelessly to support every student to make the best progress possible and to help them realise their potential. We are currently reviewing the processes we have in place to ensure all students make the best possible progress, and much like our attendance policy, I look forward to sharing this with you in September. Most importantly, we are fortunate to have a wonderful, dedicated and talented teaching staff at Victory, and like me, they are absolutely committed to doing everything in their power to help our students be successful.

Every student in the Sixth Form will be expected to engage in the range of enrichment activities on offer next year. We will be sharing these in September and as the year goes on. As part of this enrichment our students will take part in 'Social Action'. This will be activities aimed at supporting our school community. These will be enriching activities that should serve to not only benefit the wider school community but provide an excellent opportunity for our Sixth Form students to develop new skills. We have talked to them at length about the value of this in assembly.
