






Year 7 Going for Gold Winners @ Victory




Year 11 Pink Tie Positivity Winners @ Victory








Perfect sunny, icy day for our Year 7 Group 1 Snow Tubbing Trip!



Are you struggling with energy debt?

If you're struggling with debt its difficult to know where to turn. The British Gas Energy Trust would encourage you to contact your local Money Advice Agency for help before applying for a



grant. If you get advice, this will help your chances of a successful grant application.

The Individual and Families Fund

The fund is available to British Gas and non-British Gas customers with credit or pre-payment meter accounts.

Criteria that must be met:

- Pre-payment meter customers must have between £50 and £1,700 of energy debt
- Credit customers must have between £250 and £1,700 of energy debt
- You live in England, Scotland, or Wales
- You have not received a grant from the British Gas Energy Trust within the last 2 years
- You must be seeking a grant to clear an outstanding debt on a current or open gas, electricity or dual fuel energy account. The account must be in your name and relate to your main residence
- The trust does not consider awarding grants to closed accounts (e.g., if you have moved home)
- If your application is successful, your energy account will be credited with the grant. Please note the British Gas Energy Trust does not award cash payments
- You must be in or facing fuel poverty
- You have received help from a <u>money advice agency</u> or used our trusted partner's <u>self help Benefit</u> <u>Calculator tool</u> within the last 6 months

Please do not apply for our grants if you do not have energy debt, as your application will be rejected. If you are struggling financially, please visit the drop down menu from 'money and energy advice' for resources such as the Bounce back Checklist, Better Off Calculator or the Lightning Reach Financial Support Portal. Alternatively, check <u>Money and Energy Advice</u> to find a Trust funded project local to you.

If you meet all the above criteria you may be eligible for a Trust grant, click here to apply for a grant.

British Gas Energy Support Fund

The Energy Support Fund is currently open to applications from British Gas customers with credit or pre-payment meter accounts.

Criteria that must be met:

- You are a British Gas credit or pre-payment meter customer living in England, Scotland, or Wales
- You have not received a grant from the British Gas Energy Trust within the last 12 months
- You must be seeking a grant to clear an outstanding debt on a current or open gas, electricity or dual fuel energy account in your name or be a member of that household, the energy account must relate to your main residence
- You must have a minimum debt of £50 as a pre-payment meter customer, or £250 as a credit account customer
- Have a maximum £2,000 gas and/or electricity debt
- You must be in or facing Fuel Poverty
- You have received help from a <u>money advice agency</u> or used our trusted partner's <u>self help Benefit</u> <u>Calculator tool</u> within the last 6 months.

If you meet all the above criteria you may be eligible for a Trust grant, click here to apply for a grant.
